



Dear Parent,

The following checklist contains information to help you apply for a Consular Report of Birth Abroad (CRBA), which is considered a basic United States citizenship document. In addition, we recommend you also apply for a U.S. passport for your child.

Please complete the required forms. Once you have completed these forms, please email KuwaitACS@State.gov with your completed DS-2029 (CRBA application), DS-11 (passport application), and a valid local telephone number. **Only after we receive your completed forms** we will arrange your appointment via email or telephone.

- I. Required Forms (complete but do not sign):
- Application for Consular Report of Birth Abroad [DS-2029](#).
 - Passport Application [DS-11](#) and one photo of the child. Photos must be 5 cm x 5 cm square (or 2” by 2” square) and in color with a white background. The child must be facing forward with eyes open and (for babies) parents’ hands cannot be in the photo.
 - Proof of physical presence or residence in the United States. See section III below.
- II. Evidence of Parentage and Nationality:
- Child’s original Kuwait birth certificate and English translation and one photocopy of each.
 - Parents’ passports and two photocopies of the biographic data pages for each parent.
 - Parents’ marriage certificate (plus English translation, if needed) and one photocopy.
- III. If one of these applies, you will need the following additional documentation:
- There is only one American parent. Please submit evidence showing that the U.S. citizen parent was physically present in the United States for a minimum of five years in the United States, at least two of which were after the age of 14. Examples can include, but are not limited to: original school transcripts, Previous W-2’s (do not include W-2’s for overseas employment) and military service records (DD-214).
 - Both parents are U.S. citizens. Evidence that at least one parent actually resided in the United States at any time.
 - One or both parents were previously married. Please submit evidence showing legal termination through death or divorce of all previous marriages. Provide original death or divorce certificates (plus English translation, if needed) and one photocopy of each.

Both parents and the child are required to appear in person at the Embassy at the time of the interview.

Fees must be paid when the applications are submitted: \$100 for the CRBA and \$115 (or KD equivalent) for the child’s passport, payable in cash or credit (K-Net card not acceptable).
